To begin their learning on this topic, children have been thinking about the difference between things that are alive, things that used to be alive and things that have never been alive. The children went out and found examples of each of those things in our playground.

Over the last couple of days, I have spotted angel wings and shepherd crooks beginning to emerge and heard singing coming from every corner of the school which can only mean one thing - there are not many weeks left of this year! It's hard to believe that we are starting to get wheels in motion for all things Christmas! We are beginning to prepare for the Infant Nativity and the Junior Christmas Concert. More information about these events will follow early next week - we can't wait to welcome you to school and share these performances with you all.




