Our topic this half-term is: Fantastic Fossils!



During this topic, we will delve deep into all things dinosaurs! We will learn that dinosaurs are now extinct but lived on planet Earth a long, long time ago. We will find out about some of the different types of dinosaurs, and distinguish between herbivores, carnivores and omnivores. We will also think about what it would have been like to live amongst dinosaurs, and how different the world is now!

If you would like to take part in our topic at home, you could:

- Draw or paint a picture of your favourite dinosaur.
- Design your own dinosaur using 2D shapes use circles, triangles, rectangles and squares.
- Make up and record your own dinosaur story.



Remember, you can bring in any creations or add photos and videos onto your child's Seesaw account. If you have any books about dinosaurs that you would like to share with the class, please feel free to bring these in.



Home Reading & Boom Reader

Beginning this half term, children will start bringing home books that they can read using their phonics knowledge – this will be based on their ability. It is so important that your child reads every night to ensure that their phonic knowledge is being put into practice, allowing it to embed in their memory. There may be some days where children will not change their

books – on these days, they will re-read a book they are familiar with. This is deliberate as it allows repetition and encourages fluency, so please encourage your child to read and be enthusiastic about their book, whether they have a new book or a book they have read before! Your child will also continue to bring home story books and any new sounds they have learnt. You have all been so fantastic at using Boom Reader to record your child's reading so please keep it up!
