#### **Topic**

Our new topic is 'Under the Sea'. We will be reading fiction texts linked to our topic, such as 'The Snail and the Whale', by Julia Donaldson, and 'Rainbow Fish', by Marcus Pfister. We will be thinking about trips to the seaside, sea animals, and how plastic is impacting sea life. Please see our topic web to find out the specific learning across each topic area.

#### PE

PE lessons will take place every **Tuesday**. Your child will need to come dressed in their PE kit ready for activities and stay in their kit all day.



# Reading

Please continue to read with your children at home and record this on Boom Reader. The best way to support your children with their reading progression, is regular reading at home. I check Boom Reader daily, and we celebrate the children who have read the previous night. I have sent home Boom Reader logins; in case some have been misplaced.



## Phonics screening

The phonics screening will take place w/c 9<sup>th</sup> June (first week back after May half-term). We have been preparing for the screening over the previous months, and always make the preparations fun so the children don't see it as a 'test'! The children have completed several practices, and we have been running targeted support groups to close any gaps in knowledge. I will speak with parents individually regarding any specific support I feel would be beneficial at home. Please continue regular reading at home to support your child. If you have any questions about the screening, please do let me know.
