
their London Residential, hearing about the summer games or maybe even whipping up some delicious treats with the baking page!



Under the Sea

This half term we have shared stories about mermaids, sea creatures and pirates. We have also learnt a lot about different sea creatures, such as jelly fish, sharks and seals. We have searched for pirate treasure and drawn maps to find it. We have dressed up as pirates and made our friends walk the plank. Finally we have played in the new sand pit and made items in our new woodwork area.

We have progressed to numbers to 20, ordering the numbers, and working out if any are missing. We have worked out how each number to 20 is made by using resources. We have learnt to say if a number is more or less than another or if they are equal.

We have also had a fantastic sports day, the children had been practising all last half term and did themselves proud - true sports persons, congratulating their friends and sharing successes.








The Butterfly Zoo

We visited the Butterfly Zoo in Symonds Yat to see, close up, some butterflies. We were very excited to go on the bus. When we arrived we watched the information video and were then set free into the zoo. We saw butterflies feeding on banana skin and nectar, caterpillars eating leaves and some caterpillars in their chrysalis waiting to turn into butterflies. It was extremely hot in the zoo as the butterflies need it warm, afterwards we had a picnic under the shade of the trees.



Summer in Year 1

We have had the most fantastic final half-term in Year 1. We have had so much fun learning about our topic 'Under the Sea'. We have loved thinking about the seaside, underwater animals and how to look after the oceans. What a super way to end Year 1!

In our writing sessions we have been imagining that we are at the seaside. We have been using our senses to write descriptions and included some fantastic adjectives! In our topic writing we have been thinking about how we have changed since we were babies. We realised we have learnt so much!





In maths we have been learning about the numbers 20-100. We have looked closely at how we can split these numbers into tens and ones. This has helped us add and subtract these numbers. We can now do some big additions and subtractions! We are really proud of our hard work.



We have had a brilliant time learning about our topics. In Art, we have been learning about the natural artist, Andy Goldsworthy. We have loved recreating our own natural art designs! We have also been learning how to follow an algorithm, as part of our Computing. We have really enjoyed using Scratch Jr.



Year 2 News

At the end of their DT unit on fabrics and dyes the children were taught how to make their own tie-dye t-shirts. The children found tying the knots tricky but they all showed perseverance and managed to get the job done. Once knots had been tied in each t-shirt it was time to dip them into blue fabric dye. They then had to be patient as the fabric had to be left over night. It was then time to rinse then untie the knots. The children were thrilled with the results and have been proudly wearing their finished products in PE and Forest School.











The children have made amazing progress with the standard of and enthusiasm towards their writing. There is always a 'forest' of hands raised when I ask for volunteers to read out their work. The children are so confident at reading out what they have written and they listen respectfully to each other. They also love to share their work with others by displaying what they have produced and then walking around the class looking at the work of others. The children are always very complimentary towards each other.











In RSHE the children were looking at lifecycles and learning about changes that occur at each stage of life. To demonstrate their knowledge the children were challenged to create a 3d model of a lifecycle of their choice. They then had to explain their work to another group. Making and explaining the models helped the children to retain more of the knowledge into their long term memories.









The children love music lessons and have been developing their skills in accompanying music with percussion instruments.











To help improve knowledge of word classes the children filled an egg tray full of adjectives such as: hard, flimsy, blue, rough, brittle. They then went on a hunt in forest school to find items that matched.



Inspired by the animals and insects found in the school grounds the children each made a 3d model of an insect. Here you can see them creating the shape and then adding PVA and tissues ready for painting.







































Year 3





Looking Ahead



The children thoroughly enjoyed creating their own crystals in a jar - setting up their own experiments and ensuring that a variable had been changed to see how the results would differ.











amazing! It was so amazing to see all the sights of London, together with our friends!































































History @ Kingstone

At Kingstone great importance is placed on children having an understanding of what has shaped our locality and why.
